### Meals

At MennoCon19, lunch is included with your convention registration Wednesday-Friday for all who register before May 1. These will be catered meals in the dining hall. Dinner tickets will be available for purchase for individuals and groups for \$20 per person per dinner.

Breakfast is on your own. There are numerous restaurants and a grocery stores located within blocks from the convention center that provide very affordable options.

In addition Kansas City also has a new, <u>free streetcar</u>, allowing you to experience even more food options in the surrounding area.

## **Registration Recommendations**

As you register for yourself and anyone you're bringing, here are some tips to keep in mind:

- Enter all registrations with accurate and correct information. Please take time to review each registration and ensure that all personal information and choices are accurate.
- Be sure to click <u>"Save"</u> after each registration in order to save that individual's registration.
- Please make sure your account is <u>paid in full before June 1.</u> This will ensure a smooth registration process when you arrive in Kansas City.

## **Medical Release Forms**

With our new registration system, we have the ability to upload the medical release forms straight to each individual's registration and we strongly encourage all youth groups to do so. Find medical release forms <u>Convention.MennoniteUSA.org/registration</u> and complete it for each youth/child under the age of 18 who is attending. It is the responsibility of sponsors to keep a copy of all forms while attending convention.



## **Hotel Reservations**



**Housing reservation will open on Feb. 13 at 10:00 a.m.** EST. Your registration confirmation email will include a link to the housing reservation system. There are four hotel options. When making reservations, please ensure your arrival and departure dates are accurate. Take your time and get it right the first time. There is no need to make your reservations in a rush.

You have until May 31 to make your hotel reservations at convention rates. Prior to May 31, lodging reservations must be made online via the link in your registration confirmation email. Beginning June 1, you will need to contact the hotel directly to reserve rooms. The hotels will honor our convention rate for up to three days before and after convention.

Delegate sessions early in the week will seek to approve these youth representatives as official voting delegates for the remaining sessions. Step Up is the program to help youth reps connect with each other and prepare for their delegate role. There will be a place on the registration form to indicate youth will be part of Step Up. Congregations may nominate one youth rep and conferences and constituency groups may nominate two youth reps for delegate sessions in sessions in Kansas City.

Dr. Fitch will equip you with a framework that helps you learn to join God as a way of life by exploring the importance of presence, place and practices.

Healthy Boundaries 101 equips pastors with the skills necessary to navigate pastoral relationships in a healthy way that benefits others. This training fulfills the requirement for boundaries training within MC USA. (Check with your conference to ensure this meets your conference requirements.) HB 101 provides participants with a broad framework for understanding the complexities of maintaining healthy boundaries in contemporary ministry settings. Participants will explore various boundary contexts; e.g., gift giving, dual relationships, preaching and pastoral care, interpersonal relationships, technology in ministry, etc.

Participants will hear from panels of experts, tangible ways that individuals and churches can walk with immigrant communities to help meet needs and advocate for greater justice. Topics will include sanctuary and accompaniment, detention visitation and hospitality, legal services and asylum, and advocacy. Time will be provided for activities such as small group discussions, role plays, research to connect with local organizations and planning for next steps.

#### Laboring Together Toward Wholeness

Do you remember the moment when you realized that you were created in the image of God? For some of us, this has been a truth we've grown up knowing. For others, it's been a lifelong process of discovery. Shaped first by familial and cultural norms and then by peers, community and society, we each have developed an understanding of who we are created to be and how we are to be in the world. Patriarchy is a social structure in which men hold power and domination over all others. It is not God's intention for humanity and creation. We offer an alternative vision. Note: Anti-racism training is a prerequisite for this training.

#### Revelation 7:9 Journey Towards Cultural Competency (Half Day Training)
